

FORSYTH, MO.

JULY 22d, 1861:

Union, 3 wounded; Confederate, 1 killed, 3 wounded. Distance from Chadwick, Mo., 25 miles. Livery, \$2.00 for round trip.

LANE'S PRAIRIE, MO.

JULY 26th, 1861:

Union, 3 wounded; Confederate, 1 killed, 3 wounded.

Distance from Rolla, Mo., 3 miles. Livery, 50 cents for round trip.

WILSON'S CREEK, MO.

AUGUST 10th, 1861:

Union, 223 killed, 721 wounded, 291 missing; Confederate, 265 killed, 800 wounded, 30 missing,

Distance from Springfield, Mo., 9 miles. Livery, \$1.50 for round trip. Distance from Brookline, Mo., 4 miles. Livery, 50 cents for round trip.

SALEM, MO.

DECEMBER 3d, 1861:

Union, 6 killed, 10 wounded; Confederate, 16 killed, 20 wounded.

PEA RIDGE, ARK.

MARCH 6th, 7th and 8th, 1862:

Union, 203 killed, 972 wounded, 174 missing; Confederate, 1100 killed, 25 wounded, 1600 missing and captured.

Distance from Garfield, Ark., to commencement of battle, 2 miles; to Elkhorn Tavern, center of engagement. 3 miles; to point on which monunent has been erected in memory of Generals McIntosh and McCulloch, 5 miles. Livery will be from 25 to 50 cents for round trip, according to the distance.

MARCH 12th, 1862:

Confederate, 13 killed, 5 wounded.

NEOSHO, MO.

APRIL 26th, 1862:

Union, 3 killed, 3 wounded; Confederate, 30 wounded, 62 prisoners.

Union, 2 killed, 3 wounded.

OCTOBER 4th, 1863:

Union, 1 killed, 14 wounded, 43 missing.

FAYETTEVILLE, ARK.

JULY 15th, 1862:

Confederate, 150 captured.

OZARK, MO.

AUGUST 2d, 1862, and JULY 14th, 1864:

Union, 4 killed, 3 wounded; Confederate, 3 killed, 7 wounded,

NEWTONIA, MO.

SEPTEMBER 30th, 1861:

Union, f0 killed, 80 wounded, 115 missing; Confederate, 220 killed, 280 wounded.

Distance from Neosho, Mo., 11 miles. Livery, \$1.00 for round trip.

JANUARY 7th and 8th, 1863:

Union, 14 killed, 144 wounded; Confederate, 40 killed, 200 wounded and missing,

Union, 7 killed, 64 wounded; Confederate, 300 killed and wounded.

Distance from Marshfield, Mo., 25 miles. Livery, \$2.00 for round trip.


