Am advised you are to be delegates to the
Young People's Convention of the Methodist Protestant Church at
Baltimore, Maryland.

For this occasion, am pleased to advise that
round-trip rate of fare and one-half has been authorized, providing
there are 250 or more delegates in attendance by rail. Delegates
purchase one-way tickets for the going trip at \$41.16 and, if the
required minimum are in attendance, they are granted half rate for
the return, namely \$20.58, or a total of \$61.74; we issue a
certificate receipt for the fare paid for the going trip and this is
turned in to your secretary for validation and then surrendered to
the ticket agent at Baltimore as authority for the half rate returning.

We can offer excellent service as follows:
Leave Springfield at 12:45 AM, arrive St. Louis at 7:35 AM, leave St.
Louis 9:00 AM on the Pennsylvania Railroad, arrive Baltimore at 9:15
the next morning. Or leave St. Louis at 9:00 AM on the B&O, arrive
Baltimore at 1:30 PM the next day. We have a sleeper ready for
occupancy at Springfield at 10:00 PM; lower berth from Springfield to
St. Louis \$3.75, lower berth from St. Louis to Baltimore \$9.00.

The going tickets are on sale May 7th to 12th
inclusive, with final limit of May 30th for the return.
